TSTT high school students are accepted into college at an admissions rate of 96% and can qualify for a 50% minimum tuition scholarship from our partner colleges and universities. Our college graduation rate of 70% far exceeds the national average for students of color, that should serve as a model for other regions in the nation.

Technology in Teaching

## The Need

Our teaching workforce is not representative of today's diverse student populations. Among the nation's 3.5 million teachers, only 13% are teachers of color. Students of color represent 45% of all public school students.

A college education is required to enter the teaching profession. Yet, among students of color only 24% graduate from college. Nearly 60% of teachers, make the decision to become teachers before attending college.

## The Mission

To recruit, mentor and train culturally diverse and economically challenged students from high school through college and place them as effective teachers and committed leaders who strengthen schools and communities.

## The Vision

TSTT will be the national career development model that is recognized for addressing teacher shortages and increasing the number of culturally diverse educators and other professionals.

## The Success

TSTT increases academic achievement, high school and college graduation rates as well as teacher retention. Since 1994, we have grown from just seven students in one school district to nearly 800 students in the pipeline across four states. TSTT has placed over 110 graduates back in their communities as teachers and leaders. TSTT alumni attain graduate degrees and 90% remain in the teaching profession for five or more years.

## The Program

TSTT seeks to ensure that culturally diverse, economically challenged students will graduate from high school, enter college on scholarships, graduate with a degree and certification to teach in their communities as caring, committed and effective educators.

TSTT is the only trademarked organization that has developed a research based, 8 Year minority teacher training pipeline program to grow the next generation of caring, competent and committed teachers and leaders.

TSTT students begin their training in the 9th grade. Our eight year collaborative model works with school districts, colleges, and businesses to prepare high school and college students to teach by offering:
